NOTES:

1. This division had originally been raised at Quetta in June 1941. It moved to the Arakan and undertook the first advance into the area in early 1943. The division suffered a severe reversal, being withdrawn in April of that year. It concentrated at first in and around Ranchi in Assam, but then moved to Chhindwara near Nagpur. A commission examined the outcomes of the First Burma Campaign and First Arakan Campaign, and decided that the level and intensity of training was not appropriate for the conditions in Burma, nor was it sufficiently realistic in terms of the tactics and persistence of Japanese troops. The decision was taken therefore, to convert two infantry divisions into operational training formations. One of the two chosen was this division, which formally adopted its new role on 14 June 1943. The division was stationed in and around Chhindwara in the Nagpur District of central India. There was terrain suitable for jungle warfare training about twenty miles away. Troops arrived at the main camp for their unit to spend the next two weeks undergoing reception arrangements, weapons training and familiarisation training.
