NOTES:

1. This brigade was formed on 14 July 1940 with four battalions that had returned to the United Kingdom from India at the beginning of the Second World War. The brigade was posted to the embryonic Force 121 as the British Expeditionary Force for deployments overseas on combined operations. It joined Force 121 on 15 March 1942. It sailed from Greenock on 28 April 1942 bound for Madagascar, via Freetown, and Durban. It landed at Diego Suarez on 5 May 1942, the first amphibious landing by British Forces since the landings on the Dardanelles in 1916. Having secured Diego Suarez within forty-eight hours, the brigade handed over to the 22nd (East Africa) Infantry Brigade, and sailed for South Africa on 20 August 1942. The brigade then reorganised and loaded on ships to land at Majunga on the west coast on 10 September 1942. Having secured a bridgehead, the 22nd (East Africa) Infantry Brigade landed and passed through to drive into the interior and capture the capital of the island.
